

### Benton County - Washington Farms with Asian Operators Compared with All Farms





### Benton County - Washington Farms with Black or African American Operators Compared with All Farms





### Benton County - Washington Farms with Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander Operators Compared with All Farms







